<u>Club Finances</u>	<p><u>Simon Woodward</u> The 2012/2013 annual accounts were presented and because of the date of the AGM, they contained results from both the 2012 and 2013 10K races The 2012 10K produced a surplus of £6958 and 2013 £6945 Simon pointed out that without the 10K contribution, the Club would run with an annual deficit of around £2000 The balance was split between three accounts, a one year bond, a deposit account and a current account There was a one off cost during the year attributable to the 30th Anniversary Dinner</p>	
<u>Running Activities, Review of the Year</u>	<p><u>Junior Athletes, David Morley</u> Membership and participation during the year were at a record level and as a result training sessions had been split into two groups The Junior Cup had been run for a second year and again it had been successful and popular with the young athletes becoming increasingly race focussed There had been a record participation in the Chiltern League races with U13 Girls and U13 Boys being the most successful age categories. This boded well for the next season as there would be at least four U13 and U15 boys and in total there should be a potential eighteen point scorers Sportshall athletics had also been popular with Silson young athletes competing for Northamptonshire at the U11 and U13 & U15 regional finals The Junior Committee had organised both social and running events Key up coming events: The Fun Mile and BBQ, Chairmans Cup day at Kettering David concluded by saying that he felt that the foundations were in place for a successful 2013/14</p> <p><u>Senior Athletes, Heather Kirk and Simon Woodward</u> The EMGP Series had been well supported with some success Senior Females 8th Vet Females 6th</p>
